

The Helen Storrow Seminar is a WAGGGS Leadership Development event for Girl Guides and Girl Scouts aged 18-25. During the seven day programme, participants will collaborate with their peers from around the world to develop their leadership practices, learn more about environmental issues and how to take action in their community. We believe that this experience not only prepares participants to make a difference to the environment, but is a strong foundation for future leadership roles in their Associations and communities.

True to the Girl Guide and Girl Scout educational method, learning by doing is at the heart of the Helen Storrow Seminar. We want participants to not just learn about leadership and social impact, but to experience how they can make a difference. We would like each participant to plan and carry out a project to protect the environment. This could be a new project, or could build on something that is already happening in the Association. Participants will be expected to consider how their project can also benefit their Association at local or national level.

Participants will follow the WAGGGS 'Be the Change' process for their projects:

See the Change - discover a natural environment local to them, understand it, and explore the issues affecting it

Plan the Change - Learn how to address these issues and plan a project to make a meaningful difference

Make the Change - Carry out the project plan in the context of their Girl Guide or Girl Scout Association

Share the Change - Celebrate their achievements, share their learnings and use them to advocate for greater change

c) Have the support of their Association to apply and share their learning, and implement their project
